In October several of our members met in small groups to discuss a few chapters in the book titled "Everyday Spirituality" by James Hazelwood, who currently serves as a Bishop in the ELCA. We received several positive comments about this opportunity to discuss (in person or via Zoom meetings) ways in which we each experience our connection with God.

If you are like many of us, you had never participated in a Zoom meeting before March of this year. The current pandemic is encouraging us to find new ways to communicate with each other. Now our weekly schedule may include a Zoom meeting including Zoom Chat Rooms, FaceTime get togethers with family and friends and time spent helping our children and grandchildren adjust to "virtual" school. All of these activities are opportunities for personal growth.

Another resource that is new to many of us is Podcasts. These are audio recordings that can be listened to on a smartphone or device like an iPad or Kindle. James Hazelwood has a Podcast titled Everyday Spirituality that has individual recordings for each chapter of his book- each lasting about 30 minutes. He also has recordings of interviews which are slightly longer but very pertinent to issues that we are currently experiencing. We encourage you to check this out. Ask a "techie friend" or grandchild to help you out if you have questions! It's well worth the time.....something that some of us seems to have available to us right now.

Council Minutes - October

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Jim Williams at 7:01pm.

Approval of Minutes from September 2020 meeting: A motion was made, seconded, and approved by all.

Treasurer's Report:

- Income YTD 3.9% below plan (-\$8900)
 - Expenses are 10.7% below plan (+\$25,526)
 - Netting \$16,600 in the positive
- Funds: not much movement.

Finance has made a request that the loan received, Payroll Protection Plan, in the amount of \$35,000, be paid back, as we are not in need of the loan since our finances are holding their own.

Motion was made to pay off the unused loan – seconded and approved by all.

Budget planning will be held the first Wednesday in November via Zoom. Reminder that ministry team budgets are due.

Motion to Approve this month's treasurer's report was made, seconded, and approved by all.

Pastor's Report: no report, but is looking forward to discussing the re-opening of church. Pastor welcomed any questions, concerns, or discussion.

Canoeing the Mountains book discussions are on hold currently, as they do not lend well to discussion via Zoom. We will discuss again when we are able to meet in person or at a future council retreat. Before a retreat could be attended, need to adopt the re-opening policy, move slowly with guidelines, and follow county/state recommendations.

Motion to Accept Pastor's report was made, seconded, and approved by all.

Ministry Team Reports:

- **Received:** Prayer/Spirituality, Worship & Music, Service Outreach
- **Outreach:** the team is working on Thanksgiving/Christmas collection programs. Thanksgiving: donations will be collected at specific times – info will be in the newsletter. Christmas: financial support for Mentor schools parents for the "We Care" program. Afterschool program/child care. Information available in the November newsletter.
- **Stewardship:** "Everyday Spirituality" study groups are meeting and should be done by the end of the month. It was decided that no temple talks will be done before Stewardship weekend.
- **H&W:** bins containing gloves will be located by the hand sanitizer stations by entrance doors.
- **W&M:** not sure at this point what Christmas will look like. Moving forward, worship styles will alternate weekly – Traditional, then Contemporary, etc... Pastor Daubert informed us concerning his change in worship experiences and offerings to his congregation. One in person worship and one online worship – but pre-taped. We have not made any decisions at this time our plans moving forward

Council Sharing Time: Where is God at work in our lives?

Current and Ongoing Business:

- **Pictorial Directory Update:** Waiting on final proof copy from Life Touch, then it will be ready to go to print.
- **Electronic Sign:** bids for removal/building base are being worked on. Cherie led discussion of the importance of moving forward with this process of obtaining the electronic sign from Reformation. Discussion ensued. Is this sign still available? Has there been an offer on the table for the Reformation building/property and does it include the sign? Council members stated that we need to make it known that we are interested in the sign, so that it can be listed as "not part of the church sale" within a contract. How much is this sign? Pastor Steve has the contact information for who is handling the church sale at Reformation.

"As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." 1 Peter 4:10

- ◇ We have received the variance from the city, but this variance does require us to have certain measures in place for installing the sign (housing box, illumination specifics, heard, footer, sq. footage alignments etc..). Need to get bids on this work.
- ◇ Discussion took place as to where funds might be available for sign purchase and the cost for installation. It was asked if monies could come from Endowment? A request would need to go to the Endowment Committee as a presentation, but ideally other funds may be available instead of using Endowment. A firm dollar figure is needed (cost for purchasing the sign and estimates for the moving of and building the base) before we begin the search for funding. All of council believes this should happen ASAP. Pastor Steve will contact Greg to see where we are with receiving bids.

● **In-House Worship:** Jim thanked the "Re-Opening Team" who has been working on the logistics/policy for reopening church for worship. The policy was presented to council from the Re-opening team. Discussion ensued. Request for changes/additions:

- ◇ Addition to bullet point #2 *"Face masks will be available for those who may need one."*
- ◇ Addition to bullet point #3 *"Explanation as to why the Sanctuary windows will be open during worship."*
- ◇ Addition to bullet point #13 *"explain days/times when office is open to call or is leaving a message an option; when is the cutoff day; reservations made one week at a time."*

Motion to Approve this policy with the 3 additions/changes added was made, seconded, and approved by all.

- ◇ How will this policy/re-opening of church be communicated to the congregation?
 - *Pastor to mention in announcements, E-Blast, Website, Snail-mail for those without email.
 - *A letter will accompany the policy explaining the policy work (how it came about), the team, explanations, and that it has approval by council.
 - *Policy "limitations" may be adjusted/re-evaluated as we watch the community/county levels and requirements moving forward.

New Business:

● **Review of open council seats:**

- *Three open seats
- *Nominating committee for finding 2021 council members is made up of outgoing council members, council president and pastor.
- *Prayerfully think about congregation members to be asked to serve

● **CPOD Assignments:** previously scheduled assignments will not be used for the remainder of the year. Council members are asked to email Jim and let him know if you are comfortable/willing to serve for the remainder of this year. Jim was asked to write "new" CPOD duty list for moving forward.

● **Congregational Meeting:**

○ Will be virtual this year (both in December and January). Those without internet can call on the phone; voting process is still being worked on. The possibility/process of having some "in-person" members attend is also being worked on.

● **Annual Reports:** Are due to the office by December 13.

● **Council Christmas Party:** Traditional Christmas Party was decided was just not possible given Covid, but Denise spoke briefly about an alternate plan of possibly having a parking lot fellowship gathering, singing Christmas Caroles, Hot Cocoa. Cherie will talk with the Fellowship Ministry team.

Other New or Old Business:

● **Election Day:** Advent remains a polling location. Election Board has measures in place for sanitizing/social distancing etc... for allowing for a safe voting day. Church office will contact board of elections for the detailed process/plans.

Motion to Adjourn: made at 8:13pm, seconded, and approved by all.


BROWN-BAG BIBLE STUDY

What Does Luther’s Small Catechism Say About the Apostles’ Creed? {Part one}

A. **The First Article** - *On Creation*: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

What is this? or What does this mean? I believe that God has created me together with all that exists. God has given me and still preserves my body and soul: eyes, ears, and all limbs and senses; reason and all mental faculties. In addition, God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, fields, livestock, and all property—along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life. God protects me against all danger and shields and preserves me from all evil. And all this is done out of pure, fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness of mine at all! For all of this I owe it to God to thank and praise, serve and obey him. This is most certainly true.

Bible verses for study – *Psalm 8, Matthew 6: 25-33, Job 38-41, Genesis 1: 1-2:4a, Romans 4: 13-25, Psalm 139.*

Questions for reflection:

- If God’s creation is good, how do we account for all the strife in the world?
- What does “created in God’s image” mean?
- How can you tell if someone is “trustworthy”? What does it mean “to trust”?

What Does Luther's Small Catechism Say About the Apostles' Creed? (continued from page 6)

- B. **The Second Article** - *On Redemption*: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead [or, "he descended into hell," *another translation of this text in widespread use*]. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

What is this? or What does this mean? I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father in eternity, and also a true human being, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned human being. He has purchased and freed me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death. He has done all this in order that I may belong to him, live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in eternal righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he is risen from the dead and lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true.

Bible verses for study – *Isaiah 53, Luke 2: 1-20, Ephesians 1: 20-23, Mark 8: 27-33, Galatians 2: 19-21, Romans 3: 21-31.*

Questions for reflection:

- How does knowing that someone has sacrificed something for you effect your thoughts and behaviors?
- In what ways can you personally relate to Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection?
- Why do you think God chose to become fully human in the person of Jesus the Christ?
