

Points from your Parish Nurse

- ♥ Here we are more than halfway through Lent and Easter only 17 days away. How is your Lent going? Have you spent more time in prayer or meditation? Have you allowed yourself to slow down and breathe? It's not enough to just slow down, you need to be mindful of what you are doing at the moment. Focus on what's going on right now. On your actions, on your environment, and on others around you. This takes practice but is essential. When you find yourself speeding up and stressing out, pause, and take a deep breath. Then take a couple more. Feel the air coming into your lungs, and feel the stress going out. By fully focusing on each breath, you bring yourself back to the present, and slow yourself down. It's also nice to take a deep breath or two—do it now, and see what I mean! *"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."* Matthew 11: 28-29
- ♥ April is the National Parkinson's Awareness Month. Over 1 million Americans are diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease. As the population ages, that number will grow even larger. Chances are you know someone with PD. It's a neurological disease that robs individuals of control over their movements. Each person with Parkinson's experiences the disease differently. No two patients are the same. Although there is no cure for PD, great strides are being made each year into the cause and treatment for this disease. Council Minutes - February

Call to Order: 7:01pm

Meeting opened with moment of silence.

Devotion

Approval of January Council Meeting: Motion was made, seconded, and approved.

Pastor's Report:

Written report on file.

Visitations to shut-in and hospitalizations a priority and being done within restriction guidelines per location. Phone calls being made to those not comfortable with covid. Ash Wednesday- we will hold 2 worship services, and then beginning the first weekend in March, we will go back to 9am Traditional and 11:30am Contemporary worship services. Still working on logistics for live-streaming. Maybe at first, only the late service will be live-streamed.

Pastor trying to group the various tasks needing completion into one of the 3 "priorities"

*Leadership: many resources available (sub-committee, Pr. Daubert, Synod staff)

*Technology: enduring many difficulties at present (glitches within the system). Good tech team (both within the Synod and Seminaries providing resources). Pastor is asking people who watch at home to contact us with technical issues they see while watching live-stream.

*Youth Ministry: in a time of transition; good intergenerational gathering each week. Some families anxious for a youth director to be on staff; others feel that we have much less families at present, as covid has taken its toll, and maybe hiring a youth director doesn't make sense right now.

**Motion to approve Pastor's report was made, seconded, and approved.

Treasurer's Report:

Good start to the year

Expenses are less than income for the month.

Too early to look at trends

Food Pantry Fund has a healthy balance.

Administration/Housekeeping Items:

Devotion for March: Bob Adkins

Office: please be sure to submit newsletter articles as your ministry teams begin doing events and/or in need of volunteers.

Old/Ongoing Business:

Parking Lot: this was on last year's agenda. Dave Mattson will begin discussions again with BSTC, as this was first discussed within that committee (possible re-design and re-do, as the parking lot is in bad shape). Quote received last year from Ken Hamilton at approx. \$40,000.

Telecoil: to be installed on March 3. Paperwork on file. Handouts/instructions were distributed and council were encouraged to spread the word to members about its usage. Additional literature will be available in the Narthex. Moving forward with this was approved by council and not needed to be taken to the congregation for decision. Memorial funds, Endowment and congregation donations were used for purchase of the healing loop.

Youth Leader Update: small committee worked on job description and next step is an ad to be placed within Indeed. But holding at present as we have so few active youth currently – do we move forward with the hiring process? Additional feedback is needed.

Live-Stream Ministry: to be continued. Our tech team is meeting tomorrow. Many issues to be addressed. Please, please be patient while issues are worked out.

PPP Grant Money: This grant should be used for a passionate need. Sue Keeley spoke of a need in our area for a food pantry. The church office receives many phone calls about the FP and people become discouraged when they hear that the FP is not held at Advent but at St. Andrews – stating that it's too far away to attend. Sue will keep track of the number of people who call and try to find out what exact areas they are calling from.

New business:

Covenant and Code of Ethics: documents were distributed and read; council were asked to sign and date in agreement adhering to the behaviors within. Kept on file in the church office.

It was suggested that “regular council meeting attendance” be added to the covenant.

Liaison Assignments: discussion ensued. Final assignments are:

Denise: *Health & Wellness*, Tim: *Prayer & Spirituality*, Yvonne: *Property*, Jo: *Witness*, Cherie: *Fellowship*, David E: *Stewardship*, Dave M: *Outreach*, Cathy: *Worship & Music*, Thomas: *Youth & Family*, Lida: *Christian Education*, Bob: *Technology*, Eric: *Finance*

It was asked if “ministry descriptions” could be sent to council members. Sue will send.

CPOD or alternative: with the starting of 2 Sunday services again, do we need a CPOD? Discussion ensued. Suggestion of 2 people per Sunday – 1 for early service and 1 for late service. Can be a council member, previous council member, or anyone who wants to help on Sunday morning. Pastor/leadership need support on Sunday mornings. Denise will rewrite duties/scaled down version of CPOD Duties and work on a schedule.

Currently, ushers and lectors being scheduled. Do we need sign up sheets again for serving within worship? We need to reach out to more people to help and get involved.

Leadership Sub-Committee – Dave Enzerra: team made up of: Pastor Steve, Yvonne Kulma, Dave Enzerra, Chris Noble and Becky Spudich. Team Norms documents on file and sent to council to read before council meeting. How to build more effective team fundamentals? What makes a good team good? What are aspects of a good team? What are norms for effective team behavior? What are characteristics of effective council members?

Sub-committee interested in planning a “council retreat” or time of on-boarding – either off site or retreat or a few hours in house, hopefully within the next few months (team building, leadership, council on-boarding, personal relationships). Sub committee is meeting next week and will work on the next steps/options/develop a plan.

David Knott – Business Owner (just to the west of Advent): David will be giving a presentation/plans on Thursday this week at 1pm at Advent. David has plans for a mini-retreat for Veterans to be built. David is interested/asking for Advent to donate a piece of land (behind the AFC/wooded area). Pastor, Denise, Rick and maybe Cathy plan to attend to hear the presentation.

Shrove Tuesday/Soup Suppers: Rick mentioned that he was interested in these two events returning; discussions ensued. Rick will work with Cherie of Fellowship to organize and finalize details. Newsletter articles need to be done for the March newsletter to get the word out -due by February 15.

Motion to Adjourn: Motion was made, seconded, and meeting adjourned at 9:06pm.



Luther in History

At Wartburg Castle

Luther's disappearance during his return to Wittenberg was planned. Frederick III had him intercepted on his way home in the forest near Wittenberg by masked horsemen impersonating highway robbers. They escorted Luther to the security of the Wartburg Castle at Eisenach. During his stay at Wartburg, which he referred to as "my Patmos", Luther translated the New Testament from Greek into German and poured out doctrinal and polemical writings. These included a renewed attack on Archbishop Albrecht of Mainz, whom he shamed into halting the sale of indulgences in his episcopates, and a "Refutation of the Argument of Latomus," in which he expounded the principle of justification to Jacobus Latomus, an orthodox theologian from Louvain. In this work, one of his most emphatic statements on faith, he argued that every good work designed to attract God's favor is a sin. All humans are sinners by nature, he explained, and God's grace (which cannot be earned) alone can make them just. On 1 August 1521, Luther wrote to Melanchthon on the same theme: "Be a sinner, and let your sins be strong, but let your trust in Christ be stronger, and rejoice in Christ who is the victor over sin, death, and the world. We will commit sins while we are here, for this life is not a place where justice resides."

In the summer of 1521, Luther widened his target from individual pieties like indulgences and pilgrimages to doctrines at the heart of Church practice. In On the Abrogation of the Private Mass, he condemned as idolatry the idea that the mass is a sacrifice, asserting instead that it is a gift, to be received with thanksgiving by the whole congregation. His essay "On Confession, Whether the Pope has the Power to Require It," rejected compulsory confession and encouraged private confession and absolution, since "every Christian is a confessor." In November, Luther wrote The Judgement of Martin Luther on Monastic Vows. He assured monks and nuns that they could break their vows without sin, because vows were an illegitimate and vain attempt to win salvation.

WORSHIP & MUSIC NEWS

THINGS ARE CHANGING AT ADVENT.

The first weekend of March 2022, Advent church again has 3 services, 1 Saturday evening (6pm), 2 Sunday morning (9am and 11:30am) This has been a long time coming, but our goal has always been to give a quality and safe service throughout the pandemic. Our next goal is to add communion at the Altar – hopefully with the next month.

Lenten started March 2 with 2 Ash Wednesday service at 12 noon and 7pm. Midweek Lenten services will be at 12 noon and 7pm with the theme of “I Am Statements from the Book of John.” There will be soup suppers before the evening services which are being coordinated by Cherie Moore and the Fellowship committee.

Bob McClanahan worked with Warren Brown to install the Telecoil technology at our church. I was the “Guinea Pig” (I wear 1 hearing aid). Normally I hear from the person’s mouth, to the microphone, to the speakers and then into my ear. With the Telecoil technology, I now hear from the person’s mouth, straight to my ear. I can hear the words anywhere no matter which PEW I sit in. Advent has ear buds and two transponders for parishioners to try this technology. The sound quality is very good – IT IS AMAZING! My audiologist was able to set up my hearing aid with this Telecoil program. (It took 5 minutes) If you are having trouble hearing in the sanctuary, talk to me or Bob McClanahan. We’ll help you.

We are working on the live streaming process with the Technology committee. We are looking for volunteers to help. Talk to Yvonne Kulma, Eric Williamson, Greg Preske, or Bob McClanahan.

Yes, we are looking for volunteers: ushers, lectors, choir members (and down the road – communion assistants.) And now on Saturday evening we no longer have an organist. Our Sunday organist, Liz Sumiejski records the music. A volunteer is needed to play the recorded music during the service. Please let me, Doreen Mattson (216-389-7611) know if you are willing to help. (teenagers – this is a good way to get community service hours.)

We always look forward to making our services meaningful for our parishioners. If you have suggestions, questions, or comments, please let me know.
